Pursuant to Section 9 Rule III of MTC Resolution No. 8, Series of 2000, which allows the Maritime Training Council to suspend, upon notice, the accreditation of the course program / s being offered by a training center if there exists reasonable grounds that will affect the standards of training or where the evidence of culpability is strong, the accreditation granted to ZRC Training Center Phils., Inc. to conduct training and assessment for the following courses is hereby put under preventive suspension immediately upon receipt hereof and pending the resolution of the above entitled case on its merits:

- 1) BST Courses;
- 2) Proficiency in Survival Craft and Rescue Boats;
- 3) Advance Training in Fire Fighting; and
- 4) Proficiency in Fast Rescue Boats.

A suitable training site which is conducive to the conduct of practical activities ought to be accorded to the trainees of any training centers. The lack or absence thereof poses adverse effects in the manner in which the learning objectives of a particular training course should be attained.

The inability of ZRC to properly utilize its training site by reason of the conflict it has with the lessor of the land to which the same site is built proffers prima facie evidence of a defective implementation of the abovementioned course programs and that the continued conduct of the same may lead to further violations of the MTC Training Rules and Regulations. This may not only prejudice the training of our seafarers but may likewise affect national interest, hence, this suspension pending resolution of the case on the merits.
